

John M. Leventhal M.D is a Professor of Pediatrics at the Yale School of Medicine. He has been working in the field of child abuse since 1982 and was the Director of the Child Abuse Programs and Child Abuse Prevention Programs at Yale New Haven Children's Hospital from 1982 to 2019. From 2000 to 2006, he served as the Editor-in-Chief of *Child Abuse & Neglect, The International Journal*. This was the first major international journal focused on child abuse and family violence.

He has received many awards for his work in the field and for his mentoring of trainees and junior faculty. From 2015 to 2017, he served as President of the Ray Helfer Society, an international honorary society for physicians who are leaders in the field of child abuse.

His research has focused on the epidemiology of child maltreatment, distinguishing abusive from accidental injuries, perinatal risk factors for child maltreatment, and the prevention of abuse and neglect through home visiting. He has published over 190 articles, commentaries, and chapters on child maltreatment and other aspects of child health.

Dr. Leventhal received his undergraduate degree from Brown University and his medical degree from Tufts Medical School. After his pediatric residency at Yale-New Haven Hospital, he did a two-year fellowship in clinical epidemiology at the Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholars Program at Yale.
